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## **Prime area of learning:** Personal, Social and Emotional Development

#### To be able to:



talk and play with others, share, take turns, work together, self register, show sensitivity to others' needs and feelings, listen, concentrate and sit still, respond, relate to one another, form positive relationships with adults and children, dress and undress, fasten their coat,

use the toilet independently,

form opinions, express feelings, understand behavioural expectations.



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## Prime area of learning: Physical Development

#### Moving +++ Handling +++ Health and Self Care

Develop bodily co-ordination and control – good health, exercise, diet, keeping safe, toilet independently.

Run, jump, skip, throw, catch, kick a ball, climb, balance, slide, push and pull toys, ride a bike, swim.

Handle tools and equipment with increasing control, including holding pencils.









Physical Education takes place most day and the children need appropriate clothing in school everyday. They change into shorts and t-shirts, plimsolls for outside. Please name all clothing!

Children will be expected to dress and undress themselves.

#### Listening & attention+++ Understanding & Speaking








Mr. Pembery is a High Level Teaching Assistant (HLTA) and sometimes he will also be teaching in Puffins.
